TREE BOARD REPORT

- Removed 31 trees
- Machine ground 9 stumps
- Responded to 2 after hours call in
- Completed 2 hazard tree evaluations
- Pruned 202 trees
- Planted tree for Arbor Day
- Completed 5 inventory site updates
- Completed 2 tomography inspections
- Removed 3 trees and chipped brush at Golf course
- Responded to 1 fallen limb calls
- Received recognition from State and National Arbor Day foundations for 30 years TCUSA
- Sprayed 903 plum trees for fruit control

PARKS BOARD REPORT

- Started 7 days per week rest room and garbage routes
- Rest room use and trash pickup have increased due to good weather
- 51 hours of vandalism repair
- Continued with nutria and beaver trapping at Lake
- Added path gravel to lake paths
- Repaired erosion of sloped paths at Lake
- Continued spring weed control and turf growth regulator applications
- All employees back to full duty from workers comp
- Edging of sidewalk and curbs have continued
- Continued with pruning of shrub beds
- Hired final seasonal employee for weekend rest room trash routes
- Aerated all parks
- Repaired fountain second time at Martin's dock
- Did not receive grant from DNR for tree planting
- Received grant for tuition to attend Municipal Forestry Institute next March
- Received grant for playground replacement parts, all are ordered
- Set up softball fields for first tourney
- Set up contract with Columbia Security to dead bolt rest rooms prior to mag locks
- Fire at Hemlock rest rooms destroyed garbage cans, downspout and drain
- All irrigation backflow devises have passed testing
- Over seeded many areas from winter damage to turf
- Mowing increased dramatically due to weather and growth rate
