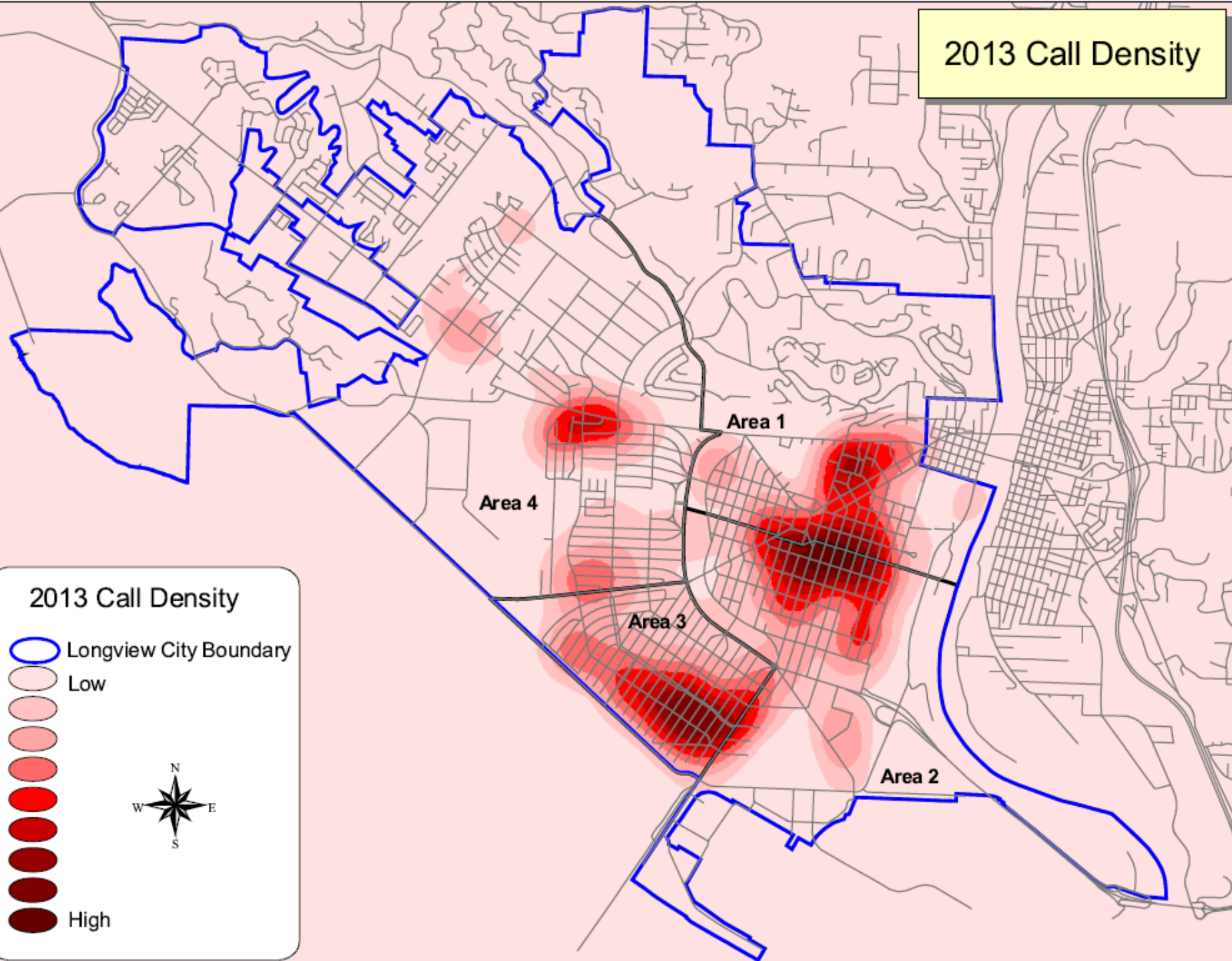

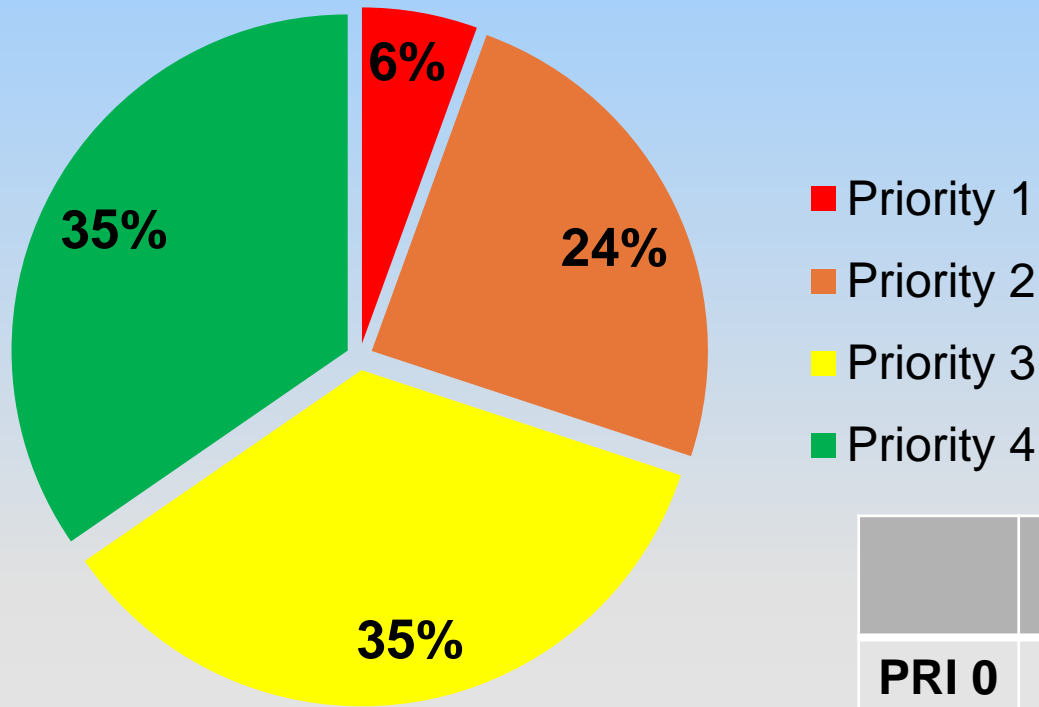

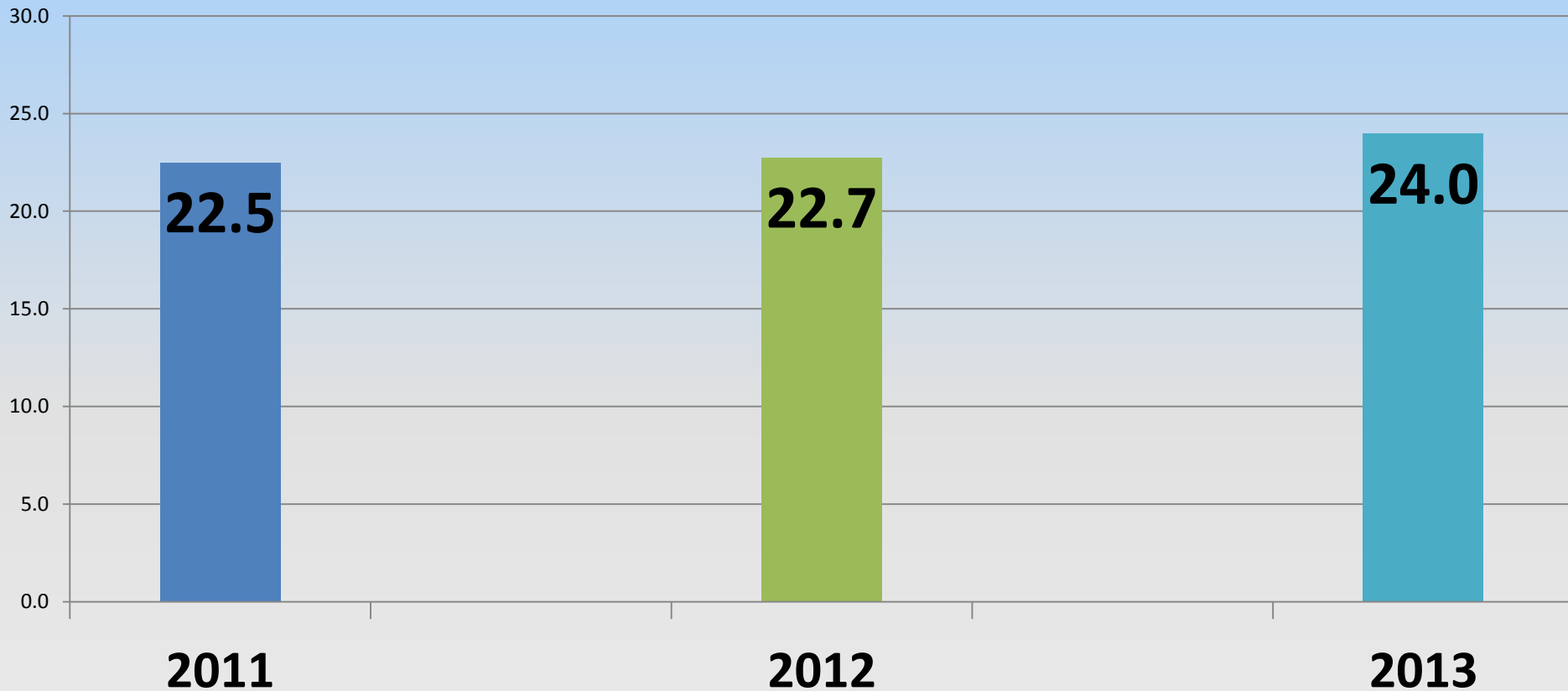




## Notable changes from 2012-2013

- Calls for service +7.5%

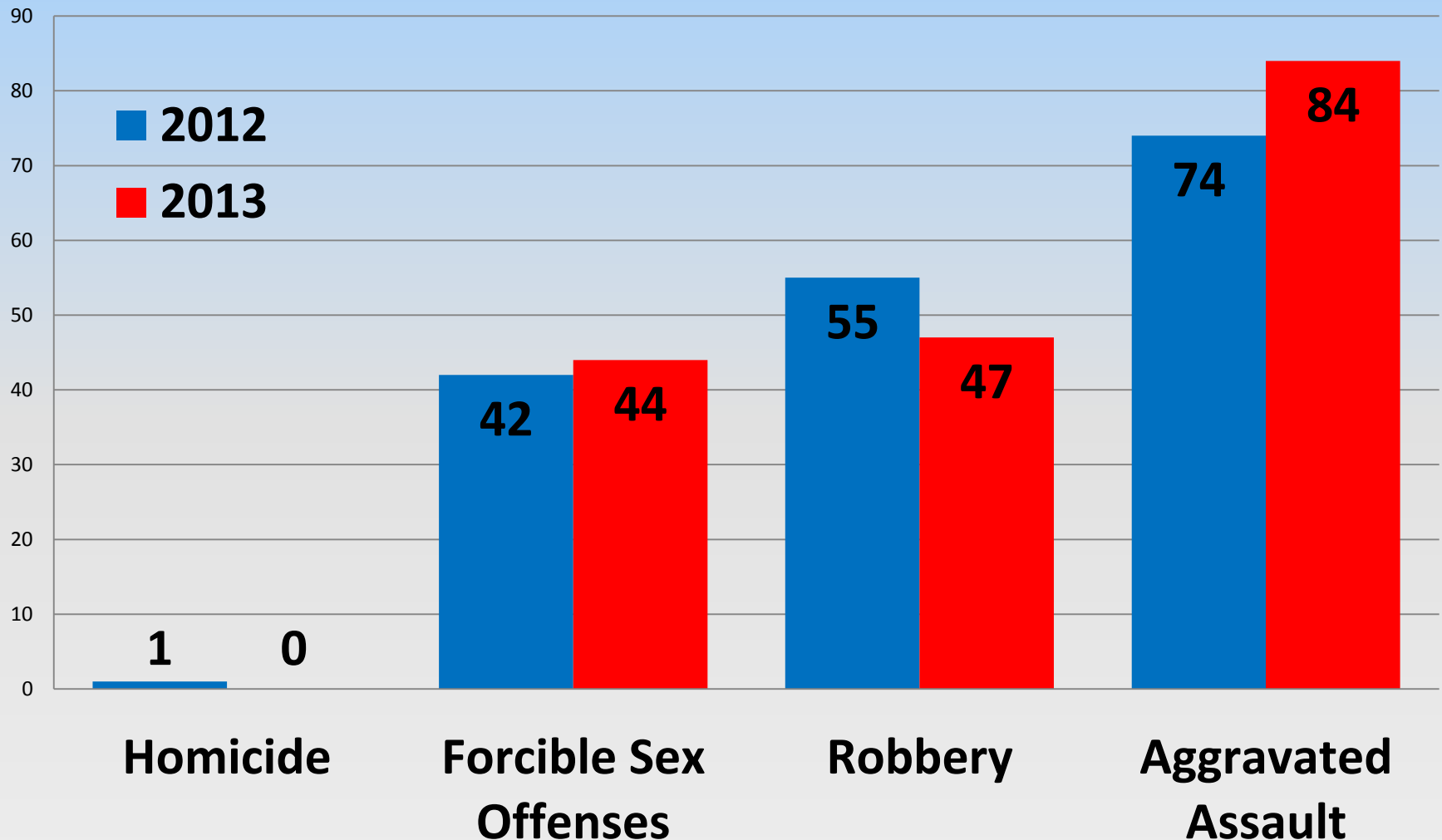
# Longview Group A *Persons* Crime Rate per 1000 population

NIBRS Group A persons offenses includes Simple & Aggravated Assault, Homicide, Robbery, Sex Offenses, Intimidation, Kidnapping

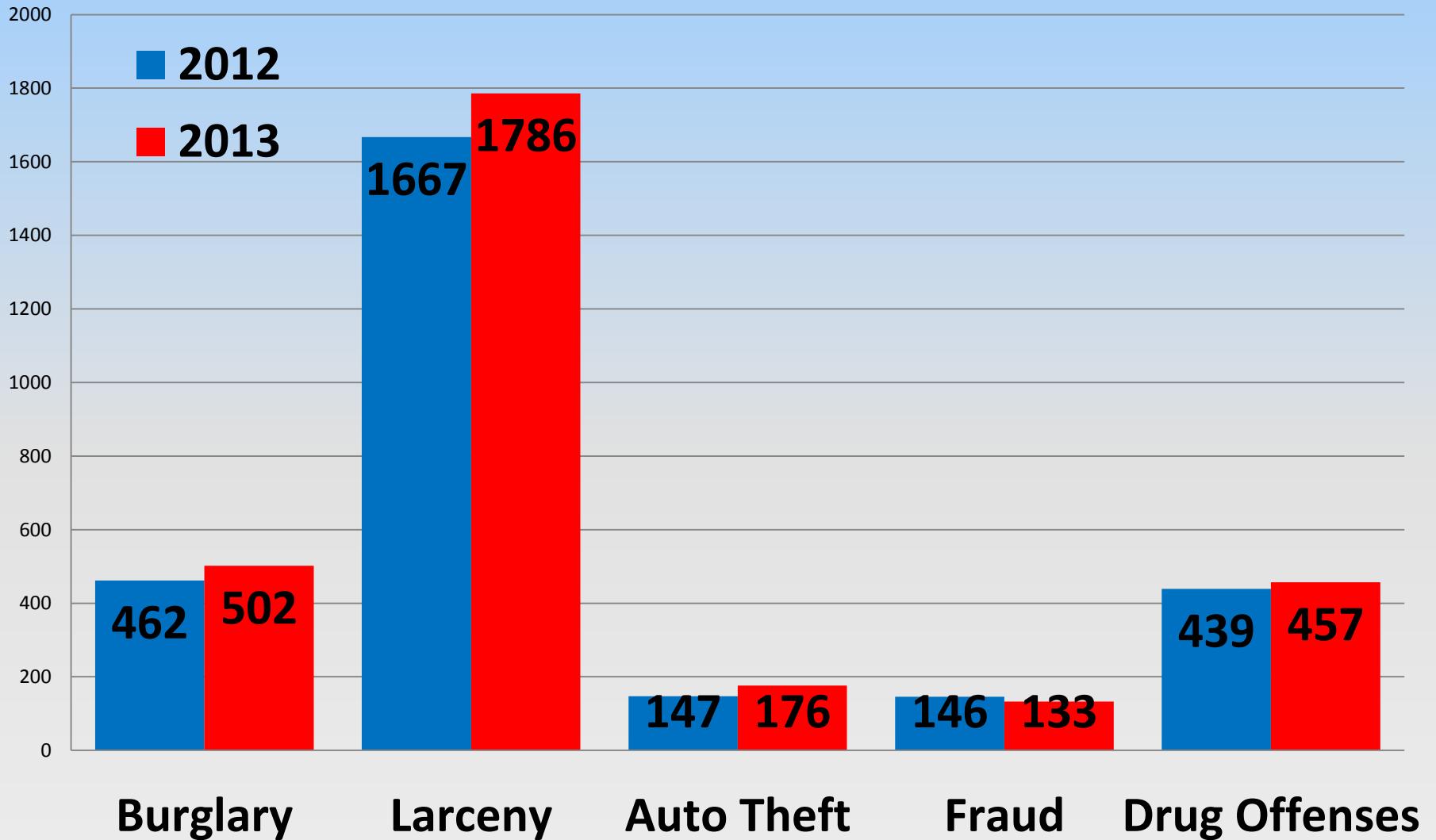
# Longview Select “Group A” Count of Persons Crimes

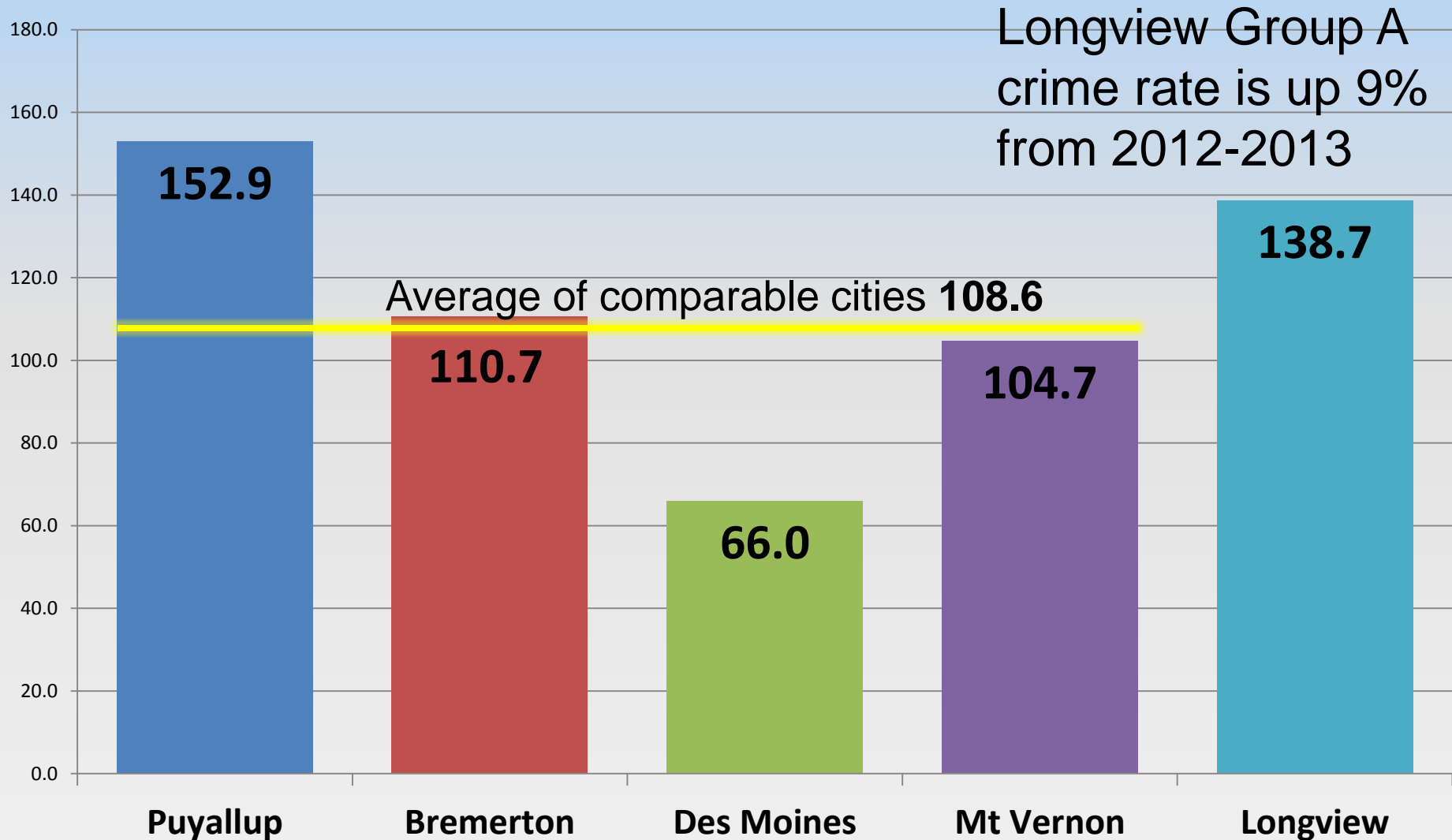
# Longview Other Group A Offenses Count

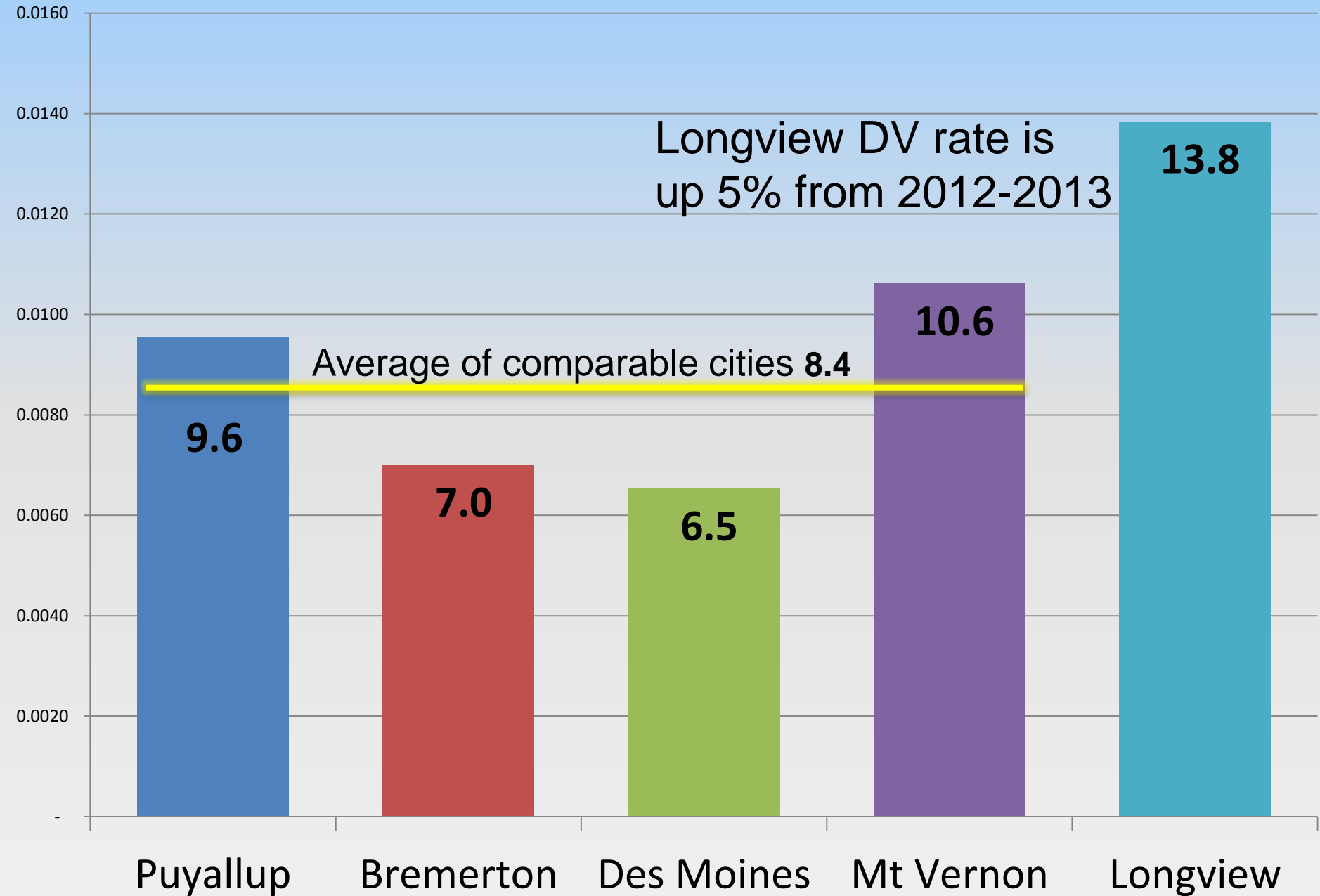

## Group A Crime Rate per 1000 population

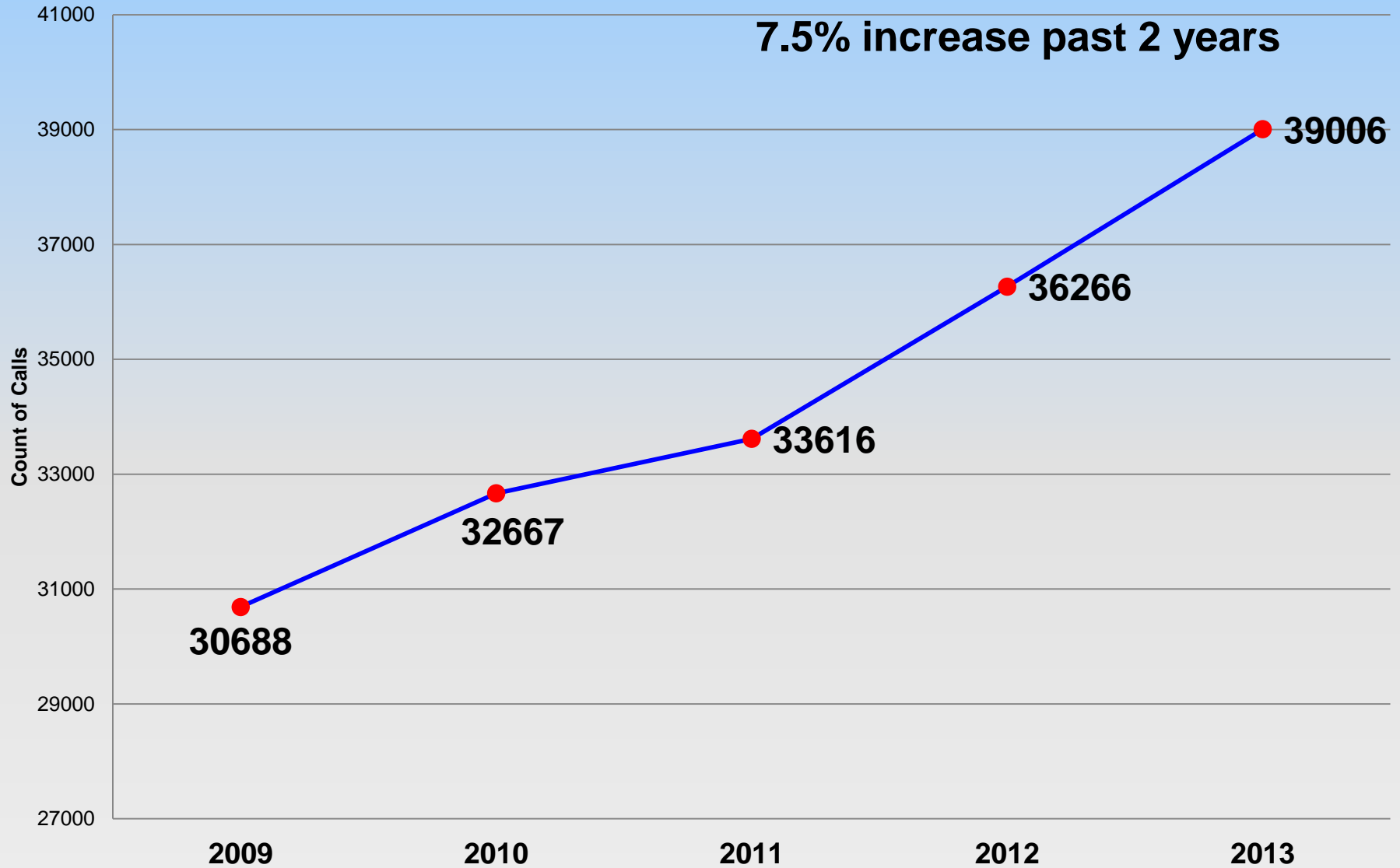




# Domestic Violence Rate per 1000



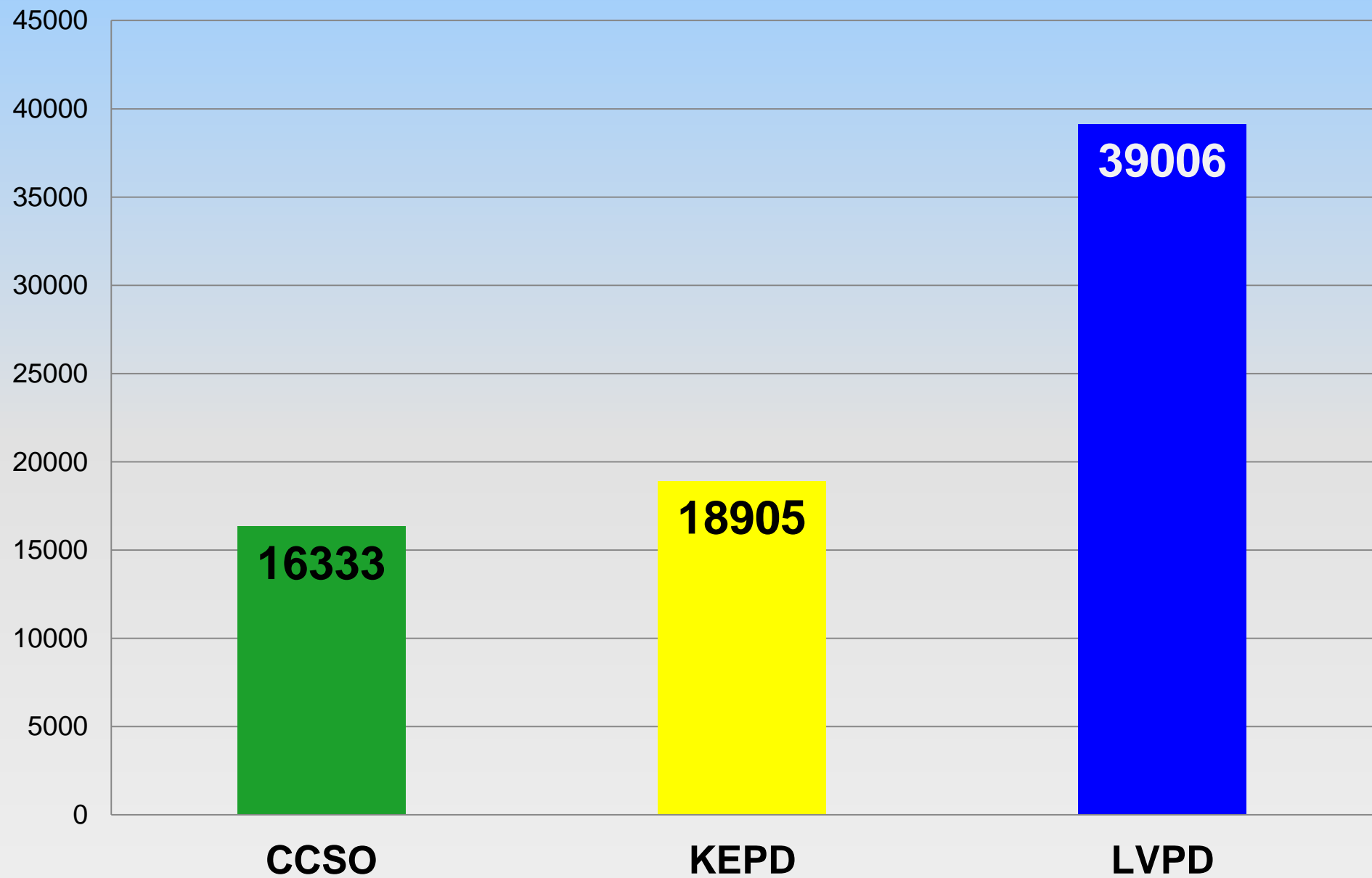
# LPD Calls for Service 5 Yr Trend



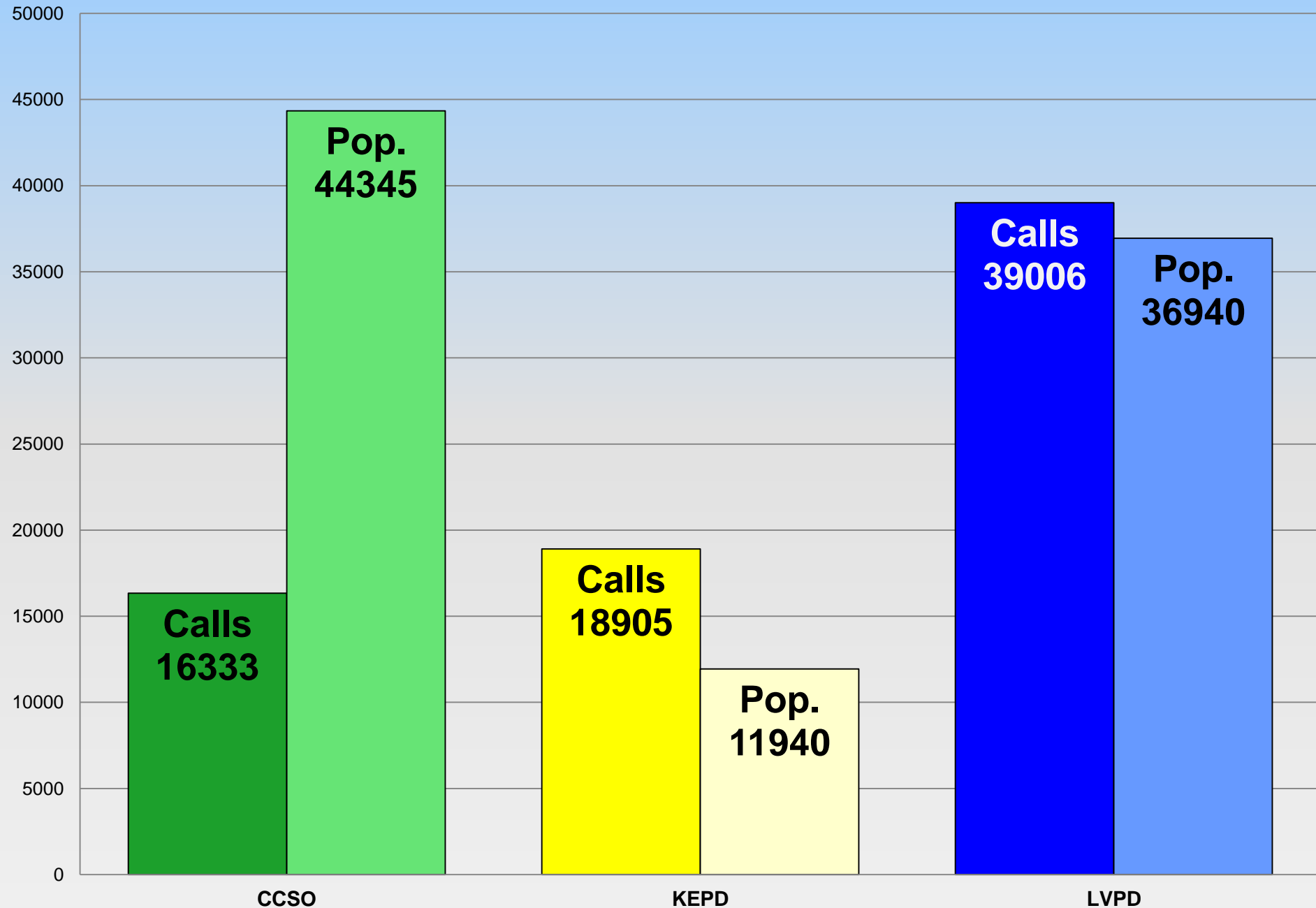
Calls for service are up 28% from 2009 to 2013

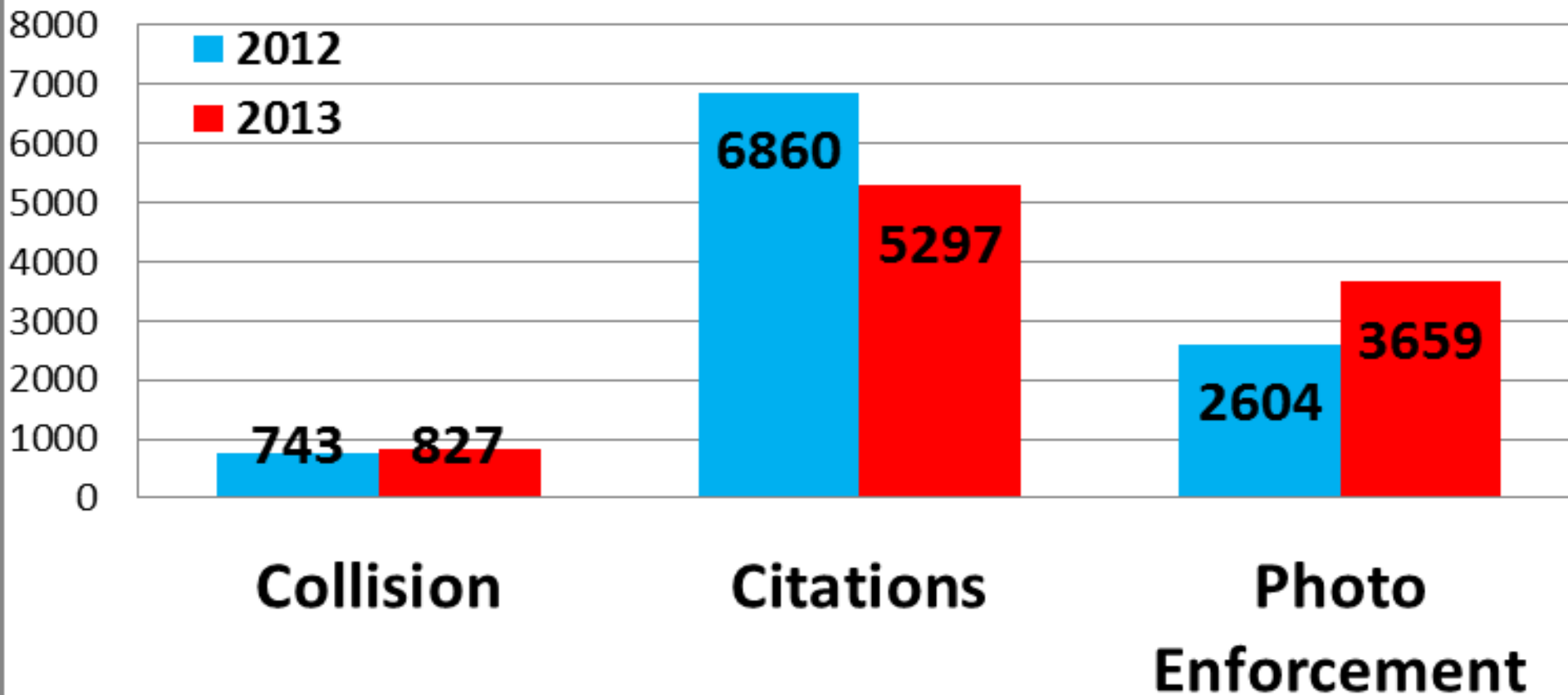

# Traffic Statistics

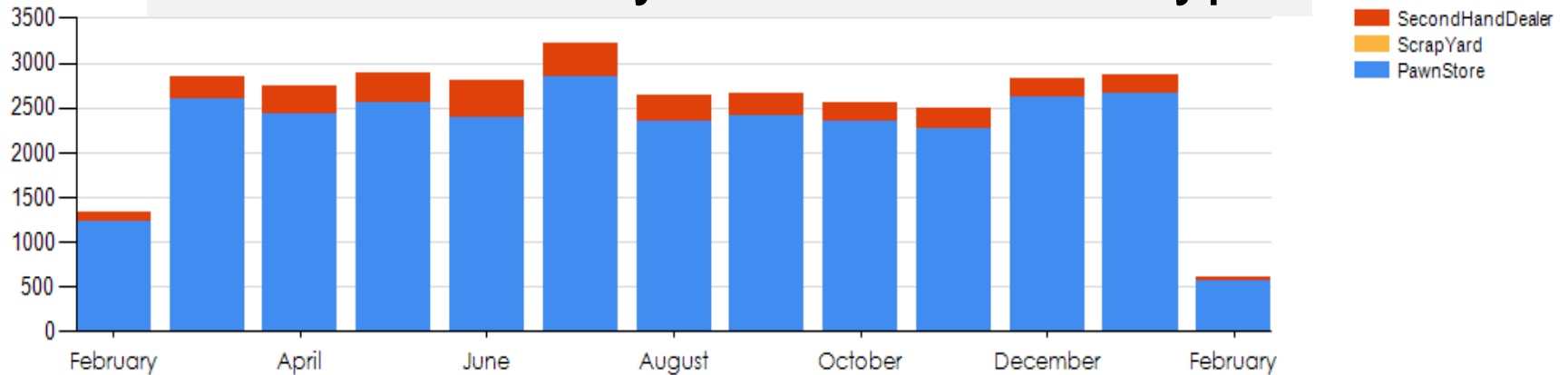


- Traffic accidents are up 11% from 2012

- We added 3 SZ cameras 9.13, added 1 more 1.14 for a total of 6 SZ cameras

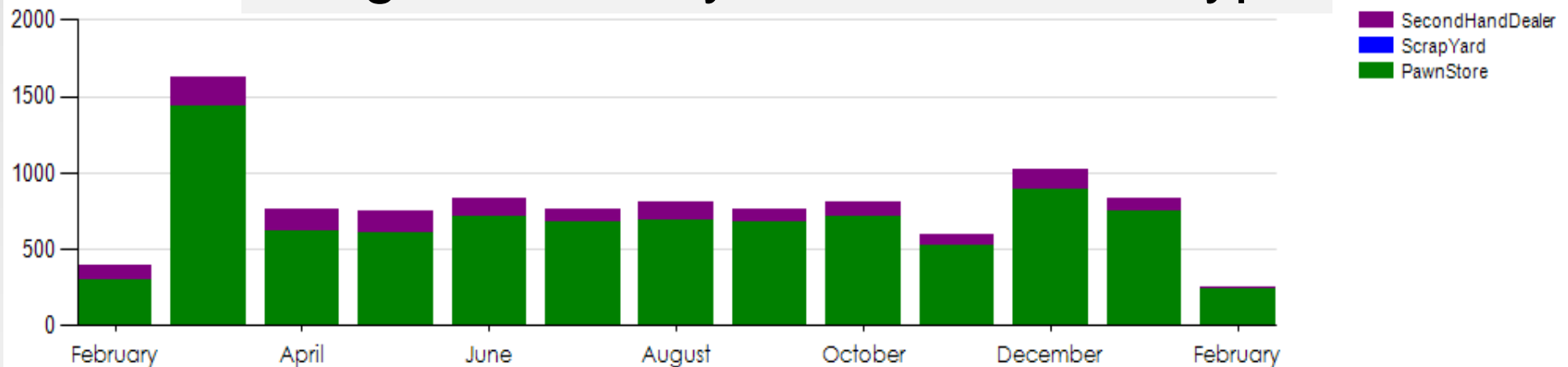
