7. New Business

a. Subleasing Youth Athletic Fields

Nick Seaver made a motion to allow non-profit athletic organizations to sublease from the organization currently holding the park usage permit upon director approval. The motion was seconded by Micah Shea and carried as stated above.

b. Mutt Mitt Bag Discussion

A recent citizen complaint to council regarding Mutt Mitt dispensers and subsequent concerns lead to research on the cost the city incurs to provide the dispensers and bags throughout the city. Curt & Jennifer will discuss possible alternatives and return findings to the board for discussion at an upcoming meeting.

c. Birch Tree Removal & Replacement Plan 2016

The prior tree removal and replacement plan is complete and lead to the discussion of the success of the program specific to tree removal. The Parks Department noted a significant decrease in Birch Tree related complaints from 2013 to 2015 as follows; 2013 – 32 calls, 2014 – 23 calls, 2015 – 5 calls. Dianne Quast made a motion to continue Birch Tree removal based on the judgment of staff. The motion was seconded by Micah Shea and passed by the board.
