Need: Lighting for the future sidewalks and seating areas is needed as a part of enhancing and completing the area surrounding the Shay Pavilion in Library Park. Lighting will contribute to the safety and security of the area, its visitors, and the locomotive itself.

Community Impact: People of all ages, races, and income levels have participated in Shay activities since it has returned to the Park. From the little girl who, after ringing the bell, pulled thirty cents out of her purse to add to the donation jar at Shay Day, to the older adults, who remember climbing on the Shay when they were kids, people are enthusiastic to have the locomotive to enjoy.

Access: The Shay will be available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week throughout the year. At special events, like Squirrel Fest and Shay Day, the engine is available to touch and feel, to visit the cab and blow the whistle. Access will improve greatly when the sidewalks are completed with park benches and lighting.

Financial Responsibility: The tangible returns on investment will be Longview businesses who serve tourists and train buffs. The return of Shay No. 5 has been celebrated in newsletters of railroad groups such as the Railroad Heritage Museum in Portland. It's photos are included on the website www.shaylocomotives.com and in the soon to be published book *Shay Locomotives. The Illustrated History.* Intangible returns are the pleasures families have at picnics and birthday parties at the Shay Pavilion. Immediate maintenance is being provided by Jeff Wilson and his crew of volunteers; long-term maintenance has been provided for by a trust given to the City of Longview by Jeff and Trish Wilson.


Cost-benefit Specific to the value of lighting, Farrington and Welsh (1) reported a cost-benefit analysis was contained in two of the thirteen studies they systematically reviewed. In these two studies, "the financial savings from reduced crimes greatly exceeded the financial costs of improved lighting".

Compliance: Lighting at these locations of the Shay Pavilion has been approved by the Historic Preservation Commission. It supports City Council's Initiative for Quality of Place.

Readiness to Proceed: As soon as the Pavilion sidewalks are completed, the light poles will be installed. Brian Magnuson has reported the foundation electrical work has been done.

Funding: Community residents and businesses have been very generous with their contributions to the Shay Pavilion. Required matching funds are available.
