How were these funds used?
Funds paid for general operating costs to manage and staff Visitor Center facility 7 days per week. Longview's contribution is approximately 15% of overall costs. Kelso Lodging Tax funds provide remainder of support.
The majority of the expenses cover Visitor Center payroll. The Chamber of Commerce receives \$18,000 annually as a management fee. This amount covers additional staff and visitor accommodation support from all Chamber employees. The remaining expenses pertain to utilities, copier, operating supplies, and facility
security.
