



**Centennial Legacy Project: Lions Picnic Shelter** 

This submission represents the Lions Centennial Legacy Committee's answer to the eight rating criteria as established by the Parks & Recreation Advisory Board in order to evaluate the importance of the project against others requesting funding:

- <u>Need:</u> This project is designed to update and improve an existing covered picnic structure at Lake Sacajawea Park which is arguably one of the most used recreational spots in the city.
- <u>Community Impact:</u> Obviously, the heavy use of this facility indicates that its continued availability is a very important aspect of the city's community services.
- <u>Access:</u> This site has been in use since the 1980's and continues to serve the citizens and visitors in this area; the updating process envisioned in this project also ensures better accessibility under ADA standards as well.
- **Financial responsibility:** The upgrades and repairs to the existing structure will not only vastly improve its longevity, it will also create an aesthetically more attractive venue for community activities.
- **Cost Benefit:** It is safe to project that, without the stated improvements, this structure will rapidly deteriorate requiring total teardown and replacement at a later date. There are few other sites in Longview that could replace the loss to community users in this part of the city, many of which have limited travel resources to go elsewhere.
- <u>Compliance:</u> This project has been reviewed and approved by the Historic Preservation Commission and is in compliance with the Parks and Recreation comprehensive plan.
- Readiness to Proceed: This project is led by the Longview Pioneer Lions in conjunction with the Longview Early Bird Lions and by the Longview Monticello Lions (who initially built this structure). Construction is slated to begin in early spring, no later than May, and scheduled to be completed no later than August 2017. Because of many other summer community service events, much of the proposed work should be completed by the first of July.
- **Funding:** All three Lions clubs are committed this project and are financially stable. The estimation of our financial involvement is based on our best judgement at this time. However, if the needs of the project exceeds this figure, we are prepared to adjust accordingly.

Finalization Draft of Project Cost Analysis for Project Completion

### Action Agenda Submitted on February 17, 2017

The purpose of this report is to finalize the cost structure for the purpose of updating, repair and construction entailed with this project. Copies of commercial cost estimates are attached within this presentation:

1. **Structure Repair** – The construction of the structure appears sound, but minor repairs including replacement of some sub-roof support slats that have deteriorated along roof edge; re-enforcing metal support rods with new lag bolts; and caulking of cracks in concrete floor.

Materials – Replacement sub-roof slats; new lag bolts; flexible concrete caulking.

Labor - Volunteer Lions

Cost Development Sub-Chair: Greg Firth & Duncan Wallace.

Cost total associated with this portion of the project: \$1,065.09

Materials: \$515.09 Labor: 55 hours @ \$10: \$550.00

2. **Roof Replacement** — Due to the age of the metal roof and for aesthetic reasons, replacement of the entire roof makes sense. Dan Hall of *SteelScapes*, is enthusiastic about providing the material (quite possibly similar in texture and color with the roof over the Shay locomotive shelter near the civic circle). Roof of nearby restroom also to be replaced with the same products to harmonize aesthetically.

Materials – Aluminum roofing provided by SteelScapes; exact text and color to be determined City City Parks & Historic Preservation Commission

Permits - Appropriate permits to be provided by the City of Longview

Installation – By approved organization or individual/s/

Cost total associated with this portion of the project: \$12,381.74

[\$3,988.46 (materials) - \$8,393.28 (labor)]

3. **Concrete Apron** — Construct a 5' concrete apron of 4" depth around the entire base of current structure with an additional 5' (x 10') extension on the north (lake) side to support a park bench (of a type as approved by both the Parks and Historic Preservation Board).

Materials – Commercially produced concrete; base rock (provided by city) necessary forms; approved park bench

Installation – Labor will be by city-approved qualified personnel

Permits - Provided by City of Longview

Cost development Sub Chair: <u>Doug Harvey.</u>

Cost total associated with this portion of the project: \$11,530 (materials-labor)

4. **Appearance and Preservation** - Pressure wash interior, coating all wood surfaces (including ceiling and tables with an oil-base stain, walnut in color; existing support posts will be wrapped in 5/8" plywood, stained to match existing wood surfaces. The base of each post (approx. 3') shall be encased in rock or brick facade.

Materials – Wood-stain (approved substance and color) and plywood plus rock/brick façade material and adhesive cement.

Equipment – Pressure washers provided by Lions

Labor - To be provided by Lions

Cost total associated with this portion of the project: \$1,851.92 (materials-labor)
