Why we need a policy -

- Helps staff communicate a uniform message to grieving parties
- Reinforces the City's control over what takes place in the right of way.
- Complaints have been received regarding this issue.

Recent Memorials

- Pacific Way and Country Club Drive
- Ocean Beach Highway and 38th Avenue
- SR 432 and Memorial Park Drive

For Council Consideration

- Adopt a policy prohibiting memorials in the right of way
 - Policy Option 1
- Adopt a policy allowing memorials in the right of way under certain conditions.
 - Policy Option 2

Option 1 - Policy prohibiting memorials

- Memorials create a visual distraction
- Memorials attract family and friends to stop and congregate next to traffic
- Memorials put the public and grieving parties at risk
- If allowed, control of memorial objects is limited due to free speech rights

Option 2 - Policy allowing memorials

- City wants to deal sensitively with grieving parties
- Memorials appear when tragic deaths occur in the right of way
- Memorial policy provides conditions to limit the risk to the public, grieving parties, and the City
- Memorial policy will limit the time the memorial can be in place to 90 days from the date memorial objects are first placed in the right of way.
- Memorial policy will allow the City to remove memorial objects for operations, maintenance, and safety reasons
